# FUTURE *in sight*

North chairman Ben Buckley believes a new look North Melbourne will be the catalyst for success, with a significant amount of new faces in leadership roles.

"It will be different, challenging and inspiring. What we have now is a fresh energy and view of the way we operate and perform. There'll be new ideas about what our standards and expectations should be going forward," he told North Media.

"With change comes a new vibrancy. From the early feedback, and from what we are already seeing for ourselves, it's a positive environment and there's a lot of optimism, energy and anticipation for what's to come."

Buckley says the changes that occurred throughout the year were difficult, but the club is in good shape.

"We are an impatient Board and club in general," he explained.

"We want to be successful. We want the team and the players to be successful. Success in our game, is all about winning premierships. We will be bold. We will be assertive. We will continue to be impatient, and we won't sit passively by and accept that being a participant, rather than being a successful team, is acceptable. And we simply will not apologise for that because that's not what this club has ever been about.

"Our members should expect better and all I ask in return, is that they come out and support their club. Come out and support, Rhyce Shaw, Brady Rawlings and the players, because we need to see more of them at games.

"Fundamentally, we have not played in a Grand Final for 20 years. I just don't think we can accept that, but I don't mean that in a disrespectful way to the people that have served our club in that time and have tried incredibly hard to get us there.

"We have to find ways to get better, and do things better than the rest of the competition.

"We initiated a review during the season and it was a very, very comprehensive review. That review identified some areas where we had to get better.

"Some changes were made during the season because we didn't want to wait and have them impact on 2020."

While reflecting on the year, Buckley paused to pay tribute to outgoing CEO & managing director, Carl Dilena.

"Carl played an incredibly important role which allowed us to be in the strong position we are in today," Buckley stated.

"He helped create an environment that saw us grow, and we are indebted to him and his service. Carl did a fantastic job creating a financial platform that wasn't just about surviving, but about giving us a chance to compete with the rest of the competition under a sustainable business model."

Looking to the future, Buckley said the Board's focus is on growth, and he says the club has the right person in new CEO, Ben Amarfio, to lead the way.

"We must continue to grow in all areas. We cannot sit back and wait," Buckley declared.

"We now move into a period of growth and we need to expand our footprint, we need more people uniting behind us and coming to games or watching on TV, we need to enhance our brand and fight to become financially independent.

"Ben Amarfio has a proven track record and has been a catalyst for growth in all organisations he's been involved with, whether it be the NBA, AFL, Austereo or most recently, Cricket Australia. He is a very highly credentialed commercial marketing executive. We feel his skills are exactly what we need right now as we push for more growth. He will help us grow the business, while maintaining a razor-sharp focus on improving the football team."

With Amarfio leading the off-field team and Rhyce Shaw and Brady Rawlings taking care of on-field matters, Buckley is ready to roll up the sleeves.

"When Rhyce came in, he brought a steadfast approach to the way he wants the game to be played and pleasingly, the players responded and together, they produced a very competitive and combative brand of football that North people know, respect and could be proud of," he said.

"There's no doubt, North has a unique brand and it's something our members have come to expect – and I think they saw that familiar brand under Rhyce.

"If they can come to each game knowing they're going to see a super combative, highly competitive and fierce side, then I think that's a game style that they'll be very happy to watch. The challenge of course is making sure that it's sustainable and consistent, and a formula for winning games and ultimately a premiership."

Asked about his tenure as chairman over the past three seasons, Buckley says it's always been about future-proofing the club.

"It's not an easy job, but it's an absolute honour," he revealed.

"You do have a huge responsibility because you effectively have 150 years of history behind you and you've got hundreds of thousands of supporters and tens of thousands of members, who, one of their great passions in life is this football club, and I'm no different in that sense. We all want to see it be successful and see it thrive and ultimately win premierships.

"In terms of my desire and ambition to do the job; I love this footy club and it's been a big part of my life for a long period of time. If I can make a meaningful contribution and leave the club in a better place than when I took over, then that's a legacy I'll be very proud of.

"I am extraordinarily excited about next year, it has been a year of change, it's been a long year ... but I am so excited about what the future holds for us with this new coaching line-up and management. I'm probably the most excited I've been for a footy season for a long period of time."

# 150 year CELEBRATIONS

North Melbourne celebrated 150 years by naming its greatest players of all-time at a special anniversary dinner.

The prestigious event also celebrated key moments and legends, and paid tribute to everyone that has made the club one of the proudest and oldest sporting organisations in Australia.

The list of North's greatest 150 players was released in the lead-up, with the Top 10 revealed on the night and headlined by none other than Wayne Carey.

In Round 20 under Friday night lights, a pre-game Mazda motorcade commemorated some of the club's most beloved figures and eras with, David Dench, Gary Cowton, Corey McKernan, Mick Martyn, Michael

Firrito and Emma Kearney completing a lap in a BT-50.

Despite a slow start, the famous Shinboner Spirit shone through with a thrilling 22 point win over Hawthorn.

The following day, the doors of the re-developed Arden St headquarters were thrown open to the public.

Members were treated to inner-sanctum tours through the new locker rooms, medical rooms and spa and sauna areas before the VFL side took to the field.

The celebrations continued in Tasmania ahead of Round 23 with the premiership cups paraded around the state.

# Carey North's BEST EVER

Wayne Carey admitted to being "humbled" when he was announced the greatest player in North's 150 years.

"These things are subjective but talk about a humbling experience," Carey said.

"I don't often get nervous any more, but to sit here and watch everyone else (in the top 10) come up, you just go, 'Wow'.

"It is very humbling to be standing here and I mean that from the heart."

Carey, 48, also paid tribute to Denis Pagan for his guidance throughout an era that yielded two premierships during the 1990s.

"If it wasn't for the leadership of Denis Pagan, I honestly don't believe we would have done anything," he said.

"Denis drove you. We wouldn't have been the team we were and I wouldn't have been the player I was without him."

Carey received a standing ovation at the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre.

The powerhouse centre half-forward booted 671 goals in 244 games, during a career spanning from 1989 to 2001 at Arden Street.

One of the game's all-time greats from Wagga, Carey played SANFL reserves at just 15. In 1987 he was recruited by North as a 16-year-old, and played with the club's under-19s in the back line.

Carey was promoted to the senior list prior to the 1989 season after dislocating his left

shoulder in a practice match early in the year. His debut eventually came in Round 11 against Fitzroy, that same year.

A big game player, Carey captained North's 1996 and 1999 premiership sides and won the Syd Barker Medal on four occasions in 1992, 1993, 1996 and 1998. He is a seven-time All-Australian representative, four of those as captain.

His other accolades include the AFLPA MVP, AFL Hall of Fame, North Melbourne Hall of Fame, North Melbourne Team of the Century (captain) and five-time club leading goal kicker.

Keith Greig, David Dench, Allen Aylett, Brent Harvey, Malcolm Blight, Wayne Schimmelbusch, Les Foote, Anthony Stevens and Ross Glendinning rounded out the top 10.

# Keith GREIG

At No.2, Greig was recruited by North at the age of 19. He was picked for his first State Representative game after only having played nine VFL matches and represented Victoria a dozen more times, and was the Big V captain in 1978.

In 1973, he won the Brownlow Medal. In 1974, he became only the eighth player to win the Brownlow twice.

North finally broke through for its first VFL premiership and Greig was among North's best with 23 disposals. Greig was appointed club captain at the start of 1976 after the retirement of Barry Davis, but resigned at the end of 1979.

Early in 1977, Greig injured his knee and underwent surgery and subsequently missed out on the 1977 premiership. However, it didn't stop him from regaining his stellar form and he won a Syd Barker Medal in 1980, and was named an All-Australian in 1983.

Greig's final VFL match was the 1985 semi-final against Footscray and he ended his career on 294 games.

# David DENCH

Recruited from West Coburg, Dench spent his entire career with North Melbourne and has long been regarded as one of the best players to ever wear the royal blue and white stripes.

A sensational defender, Dench's reputation extended well outside Arden St, and had him classed as one of the league's greatest full-backs.

A springboard for North's attacks over the journey, in 1972 Dench was appointed captain at the age of 20; one of the youngest bestowed such an honour.

He won the Syd Barker Medal on four occasions - 1971, 1976, 1977 and 1981. He represented Victoria four times, is a life member and a member of North's Team of the Century. He was inducted into the club's Hall of Fame in 2003 and elevated to Legend in 2009. He was inducted into the AFL's Hall of Fame in 2000.

David Dench played 275 games between 1969 and 1984.

# Allen AYLETT

Dr Allen Aylett is regarded as the godfather of the North Melbourne Football Club.

Aylett played 220 games and kicked 311 goals in a career spanning 1952–1964. He won the Best & Fairest from 1958–1960, was All-Australian in 1958 and 1961, won the Tassie Medal in 1958, won the Simpson Medal in 1960, and was captain from 1961–1964. He was selected in North's Team of the Century and elevated to Legend in the Hall of Fame. He is also a member of the AFL Hall of Fame.

After a stellar playing career, Allen served the club as president and was regarded as a true pioneer. His legacy includes the aggressive recruitment of star players to deliver the club's first two premierships and the creation of one of the of the most prominent events; the North Melbourne Grand Final Breakfast. As VFL president, he became the most powerful football administrator in the country and gave rise to the national competition. His achievements led to him being awarded as Officer of the Order of the British Empire, an Australian Sports Medal and Centenary Medal, and induction into the Sport Australia Hall of Fame.

# Brent HARVEY

When it comes to accolades, Harvey has won just about all of them.

Currently the AFL's games record holder with 432 under his belt, the five-time Syd Barker Medal winner was virtually unstoppable on the field with his pace, skill and football IQ combining to form a potent player.

Across his incredible 21-year career, which began in 1996, Harvey booted 518 goals, won a premiership in 1999, was selected in the All-Australian team on four occasions, and captained his country in 2008.

Harvey finished second in the Brownlow Medal count in 2007 and was regarded as one of the best midfielders/small forwards ever.

He is a member of the club's Team of the Century and future Hall of Fame inductee.

Known for his professionalism, tenacity and will to win, he sits comfortably as North's fifth best player in history.

# Malcolm BLIGHT

Although reluctant to join North from Woodville Football Club in South Australia, Blight would eventually become one of the Kangaroos' greatest.

A supremely athletic forward, Blight played 178 games in the royal blue and white stripes from 1974 to 1982.

With two premierships to his name, Blight added a Syd Barker and Brownlow Medal in 1978, adding to his reputation as one of the most skilful and consistent performers of his era.

An incredible pack mark and prolific goal kicker, Blight won the Coleman Medal in 1982 and made the VFL team of the year. He also topped the club's goalkicking tally four times.

An inductee into the club's Hall of Fame and member of the Team of the Century, he was an inaugural member of the AFL's Hall of Fame and was later elevated to Legend status.

# Wayne SCHIMMEL- BUSCH

Captain of North from 1979 to 1987, Schimmelbusch played 306 games including 29 finals and two premierships.

Recruited from Brunswick, he was capable of playing multiple positions throughout his career, but was most damaging on the wing or half-forward flank. A potent attacking player, he booted 354 goals.

A relentless and ruthless competitor, Schimmelbusch left nothing on the field and became an integral part of the club, epitomising its famous Shinboner Spirit.

He was inducted into the AFL Hall of Fame in 1997 and named in North's Team of the Century in 2001. He was also inducted as an inaugural Legend in North's Hall of Fame in 2002.



# Les FOOTE

At just 16, Les Foote first played with North Melbourne in 1941.

It was the beginning of a sensational 11-year career by a man who routinely outclassed his opponents, and quickly won the respect of the football world.

The first man to captain a North League side for four seasons, Foote was also the first to win the Syd Barker Medal more than once; eventually winning it three times, in 1945, 1949 and 1950.

Supremely skilled, Foote's ability to glide through congestion with ease was unprecedented and his trademark blind turn was a thing of beauty. Displaying a combination of power, courage and grace he was a member of interstate sides in 1946, 1947, 1950 and 1951.

Foote played 134 games, including the 1950 grand final, and kicked 105 goals.

He is a member of the North Melbourne Hall of Fame, (elevated to Legend in 2011), a team of the century member, and was inducted into the AFL Hall of Fame.





# Anthony STEVENS

As tough and gritty as they come, Stevens never took a backward step on the football field.

A damaging midfielder who became one of the game's best taggers, even serious injuries couldn't stop him from competing. His efforts to play with a severely damaged ankle in the 1999 grand final, just one of his famous feats of resilience and courage.

If ever there was a pack of players, or a ball in dispute, you would inevitably find Stevens burrowing in to win possession for his side.

A dual premiership player and All-Australian in 1998, and two-time Syd Barker Medal winner in 1997 and 1999, Stevens was appointed captain in 2002.

He played 292 games from 1989 to 2004 and was named in North's Team of the Century as ruck rover. He was also added to the club's Hall of Fame, and elevated to Legend in 2016, and was inducted into the AFL Hall of Fame.

# Ross GLENDINNING

A North Melbourne Team of the Century member and Hall of Famer, both with the club and AFL, Glendinning initially had trouble getting to Arden St from East Fremantle.

He had to sit out the entire 1977 season and missed out on a premiership, but made up for lost time once he arrived.

A highly skilled player with extraordinary marking ability, Glendinning was known for his counter attack off half-back, but could be equally as damaging playing at half-forward.

He won the Syd Barker Medal in 1982 and in 1983, going back-to-back for the club best and fairest award, was an All-Australian and took home the Brownlow Medal.

He played 190 games for North and kicked 214 goals.

# Shaw THING

Rhyce Shaw will usher in a new era at North Melbourne after being appointed senior coach, following a successful stint as caretaker.

Shaw signed a two-year contract tying him to the club until the end of 2021. Following that point, he will continue on a rolling contract.

"We wanted the best the industry could offer, and someone that would embrace the past, the present and the future of this club. We found that person in Rhyce," North chairman Ben Buckley said.

"Once we saw a body of work across four to five games, we started to see the impact and improvement in the output from the players."

Shaw impressed since taking over from Brad Scott in Round 10, winning seven of the club's remaining 12 games.

Shaw said it was a "privilege and honour to get this opportunity".

"My number 1 priority when I came in was the playing group and how they were going," Shaw said.

"Getting the senior role has probably come sooner than I expected, but I've been in footy 20 years now and I think I'm ready. I'm learning each and every day."

Shaw was voted the AFL Coaches' Association's 'Assistant Coach of the Year' twice.

"Dad is really proud. It's a special moment for our family," Shaw said.

# The Eagle has LANDED

In a major coup for North, favourite son, Brady Rawlings announced his return to Arden St, taking on the role of director of football.

Rawlings played 245 games in the royal blue and white stripes, and spent six-years with the premiership-winning West Coast Eagles, initially as an assistant coach and more recently as list manager.

Rawlings was drafted to North in 1998 with pick 15 and became one of the league's best taggers over his stellar 13-year playing career.

He won his first Syd Barker Medal in 2004; the same year he was selected to represent Australia in the International Rules Series. Two seasons later in 2006, he claimed his second best and fairest award and was awarded a third in 2010.

The Tasmanian-born Kangaroo announced his retirement in 2011 and immediately went to work with North's next generation of players as a senior recruiter and player induction coach.

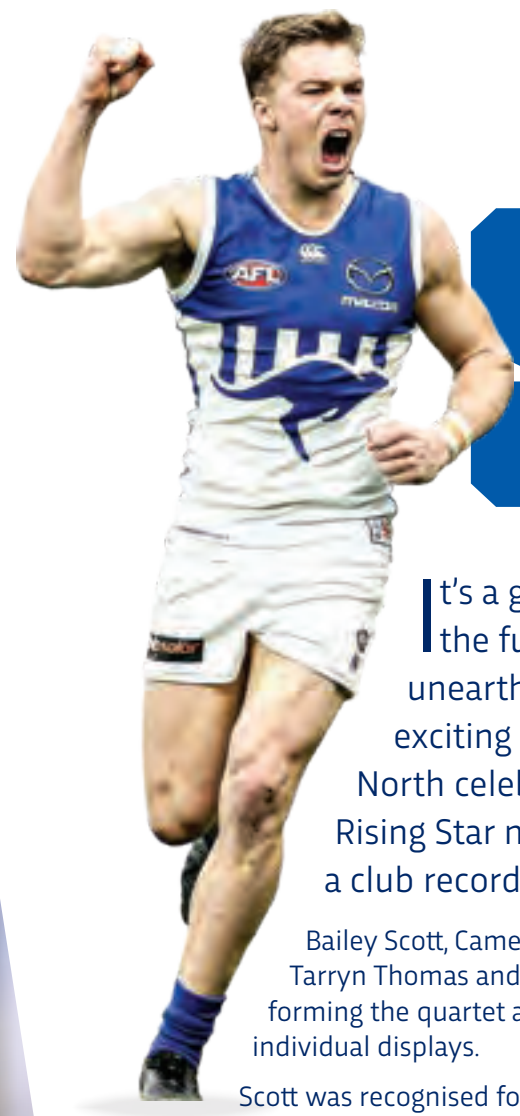
He was head-hunted by West Coast in the lead-up to the 2013 National Draft.

# The numbers GAME

**N**orth's inspirational captain Jack Ziebell and contested-ball beast Ben Cunnington celebrated 200 games this season, in Rounds 12 and 13 respectively.

Since arriving at the club with pick 9 in 2008, Ziebell knew his work was cut-out for him after finishing second-last in a time trial. Determined, he got to work and ultimately reaped the rewards debuting in Round 1 in 2009.

It set the scene for what type of player Ziebell was to become, developing into a key player in the engine room. He was announced captain in 2017 and has most recently been used as a forward.

Ziebell averaged 20.4 disposals and 4.8 tackles per game in 2019.

"I don't think there's a greater honour than pulling on the blue and white stripes week-in week-out and it is a huge honour to be a captain of this great footy club," Ziebell said.

"You're almost instilled to represent the footy club for all the past players and past supporters and families that have been part of our footy club and we're the custodians right now of North Melbourne."

Cunnington has become one of the best inside midfielders in the game, ranking 3rd in the league for clearances and 4th for contested possessions.

The dual Syd Barker Medallist's tough and unrelenting style is almost unparalleled.

The humble hard-nut put pen to paper on a new three-year-deal, moving him a step closer to being a one-club player.

"When you are running out and putting the North Melbourne jumper on, it definitely has more meaning," he said.

"The rich history behind it ... we're just not playing for ourselves, you are playing for the other thousand Shinboners who've represented us before, and the whole club.

"It's definitely got a lot more meaning and I'm trying to appreciate that more as I get older."

Jamie Macmillan celebrated 150 games in Round 11 against Richmond, while Coleman Medal runner-up Ben Brown, and Luke McDonald notched up 100 games in Round 1 and 4 respectively.

It was 50 games for Jed Anderson in Round 7, Mason Wood in Round 13 and Jy Simpkin in Round 17.

# Thompson's FAREWELL



Scott Thompson called time on a stellar 12-year career with North Melbourne.

The key defender played 240 games with the Roos, averaging 16 disposals and 5 marks.

Known for his ability to play on small and tall forwards, the 33-year-old carved out a reputation as a true warrior of the Kangaroos' backline.

"I'm excited for what the future holds," he said.

"North's been fantastic to me – such a great club and I've loved every minute of the 12 years.

"Everyone's career comes to an end and it's my time to finish up, so once the decision was made, I slept really well that night. I knew it was the right choice."

Thompson was drafted as a mature-aged recruit from Geelong's VFL side in 2007. He played his junior football at South Barwon, and was pivotal in its 2006 premiership win.

Moving into the VFL in 2007, Thompson's performances earned him attention from AFL recruiters and led to North selecting him with pick 37 in the National Draft.

When he debuted in Round 1, 2008, he never looked back and soon became a permanent fixture in defence. A player opposition forwards hated playing on, "Scooter" always made them earn it.

Among Thompson's career highlights are seven finals games, including two preliminaries in 2014 and 2015, 39 disposals in 2012, 15 marks in 2018, and an All-Australian selection and Syd Barker Medal in 2013 (tied with Daniel Wells). That same year, he was a member of North's leadership group.

"I'm pretty happy where I'm heading [with my future]," he said.

"My oldest actually said, 'Can I still barrack for the Kangaroos?' and I said, 'Yes of course you can'."

# The WRIGHT time

In the 2014 Elimination Final, North Melbourne was under siege.

Down 33 points mid-way through the third term, the side was facing an embarrassing blow-out loss. With Essendon on the attack once again, Sam Wright took a gamble and pulled off what would become a momentum shifting, intercept mark.

The ball, intended for Jobe Watson, never reached its target as North's No.19 sprung up between Watson and Brendon Goddard, to steal it. North went on to claim a remarkable come-from-behind win, defeating the Bombers by two goals.

It was just one memorable moment across Wright's solid 11-year career which began in Round 8, 2009.

Wright told teammates ongoing battles with ankle and foot problems had taken a toll on his body, and he felt unable to get back to AFL level.

"After the last surgery (ankle) I probably knew that I wasn't going to go around next year, and the advice I've been given was that I'd probably need to start focusing on life after footy and living a healthy life," Wright said.

"Me being the stubborn person I am, I wanted to get out and play one more game, but it's just become pretty evident in the last month that my body just won't allow me to do that.

"I can't train and I can't play at a high enough level to get back and play AFL."

After starting his career as a small forward, kicking 58 goals, Wright transformed into a dynamic and skilful defender, and was a big-game player who averaged 16 disposals and 5 marks throughout 136 games.

The 29-year-old played in seven finals matches, most notably in 2014 and 2015 where he averaged more than 20 disposals.

On two occasions he achieved a career-high, 32 disposal game; in Round 20, 2012 against Essendon and in Round 4, 2015 against Geelong.

"Pulling on the jumper, whether it be at VFL or AFL level, as long as it's blue and white, has always been something I've been really proud of," Wright said.

"Since walking in at age 33 in 2009, Brad has poured his heart and soul into this club.

"He led a rebuild of the club on and off the field, bringing us into the 21st century with a new vision and professional approach to coaching, player management, resourcing, sports science and our culture."

Scott coached 211 games over ten years, taking the club to eight finals, including two preliminary finals in 2014 and 2015.

"We are indebted to him for his service, loyalty and passion," Buckley added.

Scott said his decision to step down was, "what's right, not what's easy".

"There's nothing but blue sky ahead for this club. The time was right for the club to get the fresh air that it needs."

# Coaching OVERHALL

North Melbourne has completed an exciting and dramatic overhaul of the club's coaching department, with a raft of new faces bringing a wealth of experience and energy to Arden St.

In his first year at the helm, Rhyce Shaw will be surrounded by talented former players that have coached their own teams, ensuring a dynamic and vibrant mix for the players to thrive under.

"Our focus was to go after people who know how to play the game at the highest level, but also have a comprehensive understanding of what it takes to coach in their own right," Shaw told North Media.

Jade Rawlings (senior assistant / midfield), Jared Rivers (back-line), Leigh Adams (development), Heath Scotland (development) and Michael Firrito (academy coach) have joined the Kangaroos, while Gavin Brown (head of development) and Brendan Whitecross (forward-line) have taken on new roles.

Games record holder, Brent Harvey, has also taken on more responsibility as the club's new goal-kicking coach, part-time development coach and runner on match days, while David Loader continues as VFL coach.

Darren Crocker will move into the recruiting department as pro scout, but will also work closely with the coaches and players to maintain and enhance the club's envied culture.

"When the players return for pre-season training, they'll be coming back to work under some of the game's smartest former players and best thinkers as coaches," Shaw added.

"We believe they'll really enjoy working with this new coaching lineup and hope it gives them a real boost and re-energises them as we look to build on the momentum we created in the second half of the 2019 season.

"To have David Loader coaching the VFL once again is a testament to the person and coach he is. He's done an amazing job with our VFL team and the development of our younger players.

"I can't wait to roll the sleeves up and get to work with these guys and am really excited about what we've been able to put together."

Nathan Hrovat will also take on a new role in the football department, after finishing his playing career.

The 25-year-old will work as an AFL football operations coordinator and AFLW leadership consultant, while playing in the club's VFL team.

The club farewells forwards coach Leigh Tudor and list manager Michael McMahon after longstanding contributions to the club and wishes them all the best for their future endeavours.





# Trade PERIOD

It was a late trade, but one those at North Melbourne couldn't hide their excitement about when Aiden Bonar found his way to Arden St.

The super talented and athletic GWS midfielder was secured after the Roos parted with their future third-round selection in return for Bonar and a future fourth-round pick.

A former No.11 draft choice in 2017, Bonar is desperate for more opportunities after playing just six games in his two seasons.

"We're delighted to snare a player of Aiden's talent," Rhyce Shaw said.

"At 188cm, he can play as a mid, or go forward with great impact.

"Aiden is a dynamic and super athletic player and he offers us a lot of flexibility."

Bonar ranked second in the 20m sprint at the Draft Combine, and first in the vertical standing jump.

"There'll definitely be opportunities for Aiden to play, and we are really excited to see what he can bring to the table," Shaw added.

"You cannot pass up on bringing in someone of his skill level and talent, and we will be a better team with him on the list."

North also agreed to a pick swap with Melbourne to allow it more flexibility and value across the next two Drafts.

The highly valuable three for one deal saw the Roos trade out a single pick, 8, in 2019, and receive three in return including 26, 50 and a future first round pick in 2020.

"The currency we have obtained for that single pick is highly valuable for us now and in the future," North national recruiting manager, Mark Finnigan, said.

"Three selections for one was very appealing and we feel we can now turn our picks into something really promising whether that be players, or better picks this year and next year.

"This allows us to have two picks inside the first round next year; something we've never had before to my knowledge.

"We are confident it's the right move and like what it means for us in 2020, but also feel our picks will still give us great value and the players we want this year."



# Saying GOODBYE

After three years, Nathan Hrovat departed Arden St as a much loved player and person.

The small forward managed just five games in 2019, but was the ultimate team player, fulfilling the role of travelling emergency on several occasions.

Hrovat said despite the news, he will look back fondly on his time at the club.

"North Melbourne is a very, very special place," he told the Powershop Players Podcast.

"I think they just personify that hardworking sort of culture and that's exactly the way I'll look back on it. I genuinely do think North Melbourne is a unique place to be."

In his last games, the No.8 collected 21 possessions against Port Adelaide in Round 22, and 17 against Melbourne in Round 23.

Drafted with pick 21 in 2012, he was traded to North in 2016 from the Dogs.

He represented the Kangaroos on 39 occasions, taking his AFL career games to 69 and averaged 16 disposals.

Key position player Declan Watson was also delisted.

A tall key-defender, Watson was picked with selection 34 at the 2016 National Draft.

In 2017 he suffered a devastating ACL injury and took the following year to recover.

On a one-year contract extension, he showed promising signs in the VFL, but suffered another knee injury late in the season.

The club also farewelled players Red Og Murphy and Tom Wilkinson.





# 150 YEAR

## Tasmanian tour



North Melbourne's most prized possessions headed to Tasmania as celebrations continued to mark the club's 150th anniversary.

The Kangaroos' four premiership cups were toured around the state to highlight the significant contribution Tasmania has made to the game and club.

Giving back to grassroots and the community, the trip combined visits to regional and metropolitan schools, local sporting clubs and businesses, as well as iconic landmarks in Devonport, Burnie, Launceston and Hobart.

The visit also raised much needed funds for 'Give Me 5 for Kids'; a local charity supporting sick kids and their families in times of need.

Presented by Spirit of Tasmania, the tour included a meet and greet with some North greats onboard the famous ship, and ended at Blundstone Arena ahead of the Round 23 match against Melbourne.

The festivities finished on the right note with Shaun Higgins booting the match winning goal in the dying minutes.

North maintained a formidable record in Hobart. From its 22 games at Blundstone Arena, the club has won 16 games and lost just 6, for a winning percentage of 73.





# Remembering 1999

20 years had passed since North fought for redemption after its regrettable 1998 season, and players, staff and administrators gathered to reminisce.

"I remember Denis (Pagan) and myself having to get up at the '98 function," Wayne Carey recalled.

"We made the promise that we would win the flag in '99. It's a promise that you know you probably can't keep, but we did, and I'm very proud of that."

On September 25, 1999, the Roos played their third Grand Final in four years, and stayed true to their word defeating Carlton in front of 94,228 people.

For Carey, the key ingredient was an uncompromising coach in Denis Pagan.

"We were a group that needed a strong coach ... he [Denis] broke a couple, but I tell you what, he made a lot more than he broke and we needed that," Carey said.

"I think if we didn't have that, we would have walked all over someone weaker and I don't think we would

have had the success we had ... that's how I truly feel about him."

For Pagan, it was all about striking a balance between work and play.

"The boys used to play hard, but first thing Monday morning, they were there," Pagan said.

"They used to train hard and Wayne was always there at the front showing the way ... One of the by-products of socialising and having a good time was the unity ... It was one of our greatest strengths.

"It was good that we were able to bounce back in '99 and win it."

**B**en Cunningham was rewarded for his stellar season, claiming a second Syd Barker Medal.

The 28-year-old finished on 242 votes, edging out a fast-finishing Robbie Tarrant, who polled 227.

Cunnington won his first best-and-fairest in 2014, and has since risen to greater heights becoming one of the game's most damaging midfielders.

He ranked 3rd in the league for clearances (7 per game) and 4th for contested possessions (16), and had 77 more disposals than any other Kangaroo.

His season highlights also included an equal career-best 14 clearances in Round 12 against Gold Coast and an impressive 37-disposal outing against Port Adelaide in Round 22.

Such was his impact, he was named in the All-Australian squad.

Tarrant led North in most key defensive areas, finishing 1st in marks (137), intercept marks (47) and spoils (139), and an impressive 86 per cent disposal efficiency.

Recently re-signed ruckman Todd Goldstein finished 3rd after a count-back, edging out midfielder Trent Dumont. In his best year since earning All-Australian honours in 2015, Goldstein averaged 33 hit-outs and 17 disposals.

Fellow tall Tom Campbell claimed the John Law Medal, awarded to the VFL's best-and-fairest.

Jenna Bruton claimed the first ever North Melbourne Tasmanian Kangaroos' best-and-fairest medal.

The courageous midfielder finished on 107 votes, edging out 2018 league best-and-fairest, Emma Kearney (96) and talented utility, Kate Gillespie-Jones (90).

In just her second year in the AFLW, Bruton's consistency and ball-winning ability stood out, with her average disposals increasing significantly from 11 the previous season to 18.

Bruton's AFLW career followed an impressive season in the VFLW, which saw her selected in the 2017 VFLW Team of the Year.

The 158cm midfielder signed with the Kangaroos in the 2018 expansion signing period after debuting with the Western Bulldogs and winning the premiership.

Runner-up Kearney went close to claiming another award after her strong year. The club captain recorded a career-high 31 disposals in Round 5, and averaged 20.1 disposals per game.

In third place, Gillespie-Jones showcased her raw strength and power all over the ground and in the ruck. A career-best season, she averaged 11.7 disposals, 3.6 marks and 5.7 tackles.

# HERStory

Lena Yacine leapt out of her chair, threw her arms up freely as her body began to sway with the flow of the music beat.

The music was loud and filled the room with electricity. Soon her body's movements became somewhat involuntary, such was the power of the song and energy surrounding her, as other women joined in.

"It was so liberating," Yacine recalled.

An aspiring policewoman, Yacine felt euphoric on the camp with other Muslim women in rural Victoria.

"In our religion, Islam, a woman is required to cover and wear a head scarf around men, who are not family," she explained.

"But the camp, being staffed and attended by only women, changed the energy.

"We didn't have to worry about how we acted or what we looked like; so most of us took our scarves off.

"We would break out in dances in the middle of the room, and the environment really just made us comfortable enough to do that."

The chance to embrace her sisterhood, just as special.

"It was easier as just women to open up to each other and get out of our comfort zones," Yacine continued.

"Even though we had never met each other before we had a common understanding."

The women that attended The Huddle's HERStory camp at YMCA Lady Northcote were from all over the world including Australia, Somalia, Eritrea, Morocco, and Turkey.

"Right away, from when we got on the bus, everyone connected," Yacine said.

"I have never been in an environment where everyone was friends, there wasn't one person who was a little off or left out, it was amazing.

"The activities definitely pushed us all of out our comfort zones. We did the high ropes course, a leap of faith, went swimming, played basketball, had a camp fire, and just got to hang out."

Inspired by the camp and her experiences, Yacine wants to stay involved.

"I want to start volunteering with The Huddle," she said.

"I see what The Huddle does, and how much it helps the communities in this area, and I want to be a part of that.

"My parents came to Melbourne in 1989 from Morocco for better opportunities and to give us kids a better life.

"And I know what it feels like to not be able to afford a tutor or afford to go to a sleep-away camp. The Huddle is providing these things, and supporting these communities."

This passion to promote inclusion, inspired by her own experiences.

"Growing up, finances were always a bit tight, but I've seen people in worse situations which has humbled me and really made me realise that there's so much work to be done in our communities," she said.

"I want to help better the quality of life, our quality of education and opportunities for work. It's all so important.

"I just want to do my best, and I know giving a couple hours here or there is not really that big but anything makes a difference, I really believe that."

Besides looking to The Huddle to help improve her community, Yacine wants to devote her professional life to the same goal.

"I want to join the police force," she said.

"I feel like there isn't enough representation of covered women, officers from ethnic backgrounds, or women in general.

"I think when someone looks at the police, especially people of colour or from diverse ethnic backgrounds, there is a certain amount of mistrust.

"If we could look at the police force, and see more people that look like us, then we would think, 'oh, they're like me, they understand'."


